## **Key Stage 3 Science Club – A Smashing Success!**


Our Key Stage 3 Science Club had a smashing time this week as we explored the chemical reaction between iron and sulphur.

## **Update on Behaviour Expectations: B2 Consequences**

Following helpful feedback from parents, we want to clarify our approach regarding B2 behaviour incidents.

If a student receives two B2s in one day, they will be placed in the Remove Room for a period of one full day, which includes social time.

This policy has been clearly communicated to students during assemblies, form time, and is also displayed on posters across the school.

It's important to note that B2s account for only 17% of all recorded negative behaviour incidents, and the majority of our students have not received a B2. We are proud of the positive behaviour shown by most of our students and remain committed to maintaining a safe and respectful learning environment for all.
