Inspiring Revision: KS4 Students Learn from Motivational Speaker Kevin Hayes



Last week, our Key Stage Four students had the opportunity to work with motivational speaker Kevin Hayes, to gain a fresh insight into how to revise effectively and confidently.

Kevin, from Constant Change Company in South London, has been helping people develop personally and professionally since 1990, working across corporate, academic, and healthcare settings.

Trained in Psychotherapy and Neuro-Linguistic Programming, he specialises in teaching life and learning skills in schools, colleges and universities nationwide. What makes Kevin particularly unique is his additional 30-year career as a professional stand-up comedy magician, actor, and singer. By blending his performance skills with his coaching expertise, he creates an atmosphere that is both relaxed and energising—an ideal environment for learning.

During the sessions, Kevin spoke about the power of self-testing, as well as how using both sides of the brain can help students extract key information from written text. Students were then challenged to create their own mind maps or “brain dumps,” as Kevin enthusiastically called them, while being treated to a few of his impressive magic tricks along the way.

Kevin also stayed on to meet with parents in the evening, demonstrating practical revision techniques and emphasising the importance of parental involvement, even if it has been a while since you were in a classroom yourself. Thank you to all the parents who took the time to attend.

MVC Futures Talk with: Dr Molly Morgan-Jones Director of Policy at the British Academy

Today we were delighted to welcome Dr Molly, Director of Policy at the British Academy, for an inspiring Futures Talk. She captivated students with a behind-the-scenes look at how policies are shaped and how big ideas become actions that influence society. Dr Molly described how her role brings together civil servants, researchers, and academics to tackle complex challenges and design evidence-based policies.



She highlighted the essential skills needed in the field, from collaboration and clear communication to critical thinking and the ability to navigate rapidly changing issues.

She also shared the global dimension of her work. Just last week, she attended the COP climate conference in Rio, demonstrating how careers in policy can take you across the world and place you at the heart of major conversations about our planet's future.

Students left with a richer understanding of how humanities and social sciences can drive meaningful change and why these skills are vital in shaping the decisions that impact us all.

Maths Department Update

The Maths department have been very busy with the Maths Inspiration trip to Cambridge University with 19 Key Stage 4 students. It was a fantastic event with talks from 3 people, where the probability of winning the jackpot in the lottery was calculated, there was a heads or tails experiment, the Pythagorean distance between a fish, monkey and dog was discussed (linking to how AI works) and the most efficient spread of flower seeds was mathematically modelled with stunning visual effects. The students were a credit to the school in terms of their engagement and interest.

Students also took part in the Christmas Maths challenge on Thursday lunchtime, and we had over 50 students attend. Our Year 11 prefects organised a timed multiplication challenge and we had Christmas themed Madison problems to solve too. All students did really well and received a chocolate and a raffle ticket.

Finally, it has been a busy term but we would like to say well done and thank you to all our students for their fantastic approach to Maths – showing great curiosity and resilience throughout.

Their creativity truly lit up the room!

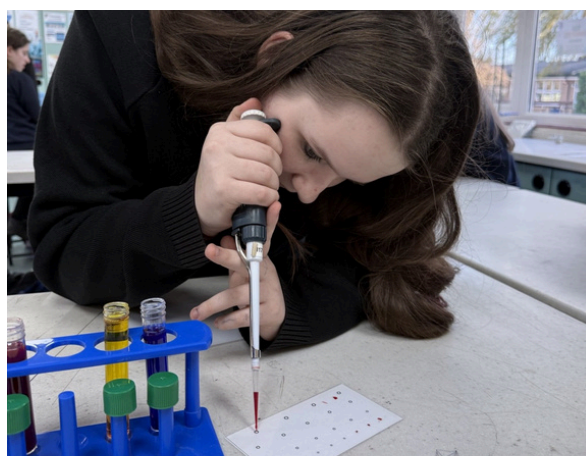
