Dear parents and carers,

We have been on an exciting six week journey and I am delighted with the progress we have made. I am proud of how hard the students have worked on our journey to excellence.

As parents I'm sure you are keen to receive feedback as to the progress of improvements we are making as a school. This half term we have received two important quality assurance visits. The first visit was by Paul Lawrence, the Director of Secondary within the Trust. Paul was pleased to see the changes underway: "The site seemed markedly calmer and more orderly. Pupils could tell that there is a push to transform their expectations and behaviour, and they are starting to respond accordingly." Last week we welcomed Roy Blatchford back into school who led an independent quality assurance review. Roy undertook a visit of the school in May 2024 and he also acknowledged the improvements that have happened in the past five weeks: "A new headteacher, ably supported by the trust, took up post in January 2025. It is early days, yet a page has happily been turned. By common consent, there has been a radical shift in most students' attitudes to learning and in the consistency with which most staff apply the behaviour reset."

After half term we will be pushing again on our improvements with a new theme of 'Community and Culture'. I will be sharing more details on this with students on the first day back in assemblies. I wish you all a restful half term break.

SCHOOL BUSES

Please make your child aware of the bus code of conduct below.

SCHOOL BUS CODE OF CONDUCT

Responsibility: All students are expected to behave in a responsible and courteous manner when travelling on the school buses.

Rights: All students have the right to travel to and from school in safety. Any behaviour which distracts the driver is dangerous and will not be tolerated.

Rules: All buses have rules. Students travelling on the bus should respect the rules. You must only travel on the bus allocated to you and carry your bus pass at all times. Lost passes for Council-run buses must be replaced at a cost of £8.50 and can be ordered via the online form available <u>here</u>. A temporary pass can be obtained from the school reception, which is valid for one week. Replacement passes for the Royston bus are issued by reception once payment has been received.

The school Code of Conduct applies off the premises during school visits and when travelling to and from school. Students who do not heed our Code of Conduct will be dealt with in accordance with our published behaviour policy. A permanent ban from the buses could apply.

Please remember:

- 1. Arrive at the bus stop 5 minutes before the scheduled departure time.
- 2. Wait sensibly at the bus stop
- 3. If a bus is late in the morning, wait at least 20 mins. If the bus is late at the end of a day, wait in an orderly queue at the front of the school.
- 4. The school code of conduct applies on the buses.
- 5. Smoking sanctions apply on the buses, in the same way as they do in school.
- 6. Stay seated whilst travelling, and wear the seat belt.
- 7. No eating, drinking or littering.
- 8. Treat each other with respect.

Code of Conduct for bus journeys

- We are still at school on the bus, so act in the same way
- Have your bus pass ready to show the driver
- · Respect the seats and wear seatbelts where provided
- · Be patient with the drivers they do not decide the route
- Stay in your seat and do not distract the driver
- Think about others (especially when listening to music not everyone will want to listen)
- Never throw anything
- Obey the instructions of the bus driver and the bus leaders.
