We are delighted with the way that the Year 11 students have approached their GCSE examinations.

It has been lovely talking to so many after the exams and them feeling so positive. This is a testament to the hard work and preparation they have put into their revision and ensuring they are ready.

We would also like to thank you for your continued support with the examinations and in helping your child to be ready to perform to their best.

A reminder that **study leave starts on 15th May** and that students only need to come to school when they have an exam arriving in good time (8.40 for a morning examination and 12.40 for an afternoon examination) so that they are in the best frame of mind possible for the exam.

Attendance Matters

This week in assembly, we are turning the spotlight on **attendance** — not just turning up but turning up consistently.

Why does it matter so much? Because the link between attendance and achievement is clear. Recent data shows that **Year 11 pupils with near-perfect attendance are almost twice as likely to achieve a grade 5 or above in English and Maths** compared to those attending just 90– 95% of the time.

Let's put that into perspective: missing just **10 extra days across the school year** can reduce the chances of hitting those key grades by around **50%**.

That's a huge impact for what might seem like just a few days. We understand that achieving 100% attendance is difficult — life happens. But aiming for **95% or higher** should be the goal for every student. Every day in school matters. Every lesson counts.

What you can do:

- If you're feeling unwell or can't attend for another reason, a parent or carer should call the school or email absence@melbournvc.org before 8am with your child's name and the reason for absence.
- Appointments (like the dentist or doctor) should ideally be made outside school hours. If that's not possible, please provide evidence of the appointment and where possible, let us know in advance.

Let's make every school day count!
