

Maths Department News

In maths, students are coming towards the end of the topic “Number” and will be moving on to “Algebra”. To support students with their understanding of negative numbers (especially in Year 7), some teachers have been using double sided counters, where the red side is negative and the yellow side is positive. Putting one red side and one yellow side beside each other creates what we call a “zero pair”, with the net value being zero! This then allows students to add positive (yellow counter) or negative numbers (red counter), create more zero pairs to help them visualise how negative numbers work (it supports going beyond “two negatives make a positive” which some parents may remember from their school days!).

Students will receive their knowledge organisers for maths next week (they will have an A4 one to put in their knowledge organiser folder and one to stick in to their class book). These are essential tools for students to see the topics and content of what they are studying this term, as well as having Sparx Maths reference codes for further practice questions on particular areas. We will be introducing Maths revision guides to students and to parents with opportunities to buy them in the coming weeks. Students are expected to refer to their knowledge organiser for support in lessons and with homework.

Sparx Maths homework has been set and is due in every Wednesday. For Key Stage 3 classes, students have 30 minutes of homework and for Key Stage 4 classes they have 60 minutes. Students are expected to complete this each week and teachers are able to support students with areas they struggled with in lessons. Attendance Matters

Why does it matter so much, because the link between attendance and achievement is clear. Recent data shows that Year 11 pupils with near-perfect attendance are almost twice as likely to achieve a grade 5 or above in English and Maths compared to those attending just 90–95% of the time. Let's put that into perspective: missing just 10 extra days across the school year can reduce the chances of hitting those key grades by around 50%. That's a huge impact for what might seem like just a few days.

We understand that achieving 100% attendance is difficult — life happens. But aiming for 95% or higher should be the goal for every student. Every day in school matters. Every lesson counts.

What you can do:

If you're feeling unwell or can't attend for another reason, a parent or carer should call the school or email absence@melbournvc.org **before 8am** with your child's name and the reason for absence. Appointments (like the dentist or doctor) should ideally be made outside school hours. If that's not possible, please provide evidence of the appointment and where possible, let us know in advance. Let's make every school day count.
