# **Maths Department Update**

Students in Maths have been working hard on their Geometry topic, with the short Data topic to follow.

This week we sent a letter to all parents in Years 7 to 10 to inform them of an upcoming assessment in Maths based on all topics covered this term. To clarify, this is a "measured formative task" (MFT) in line with our new assessment policy. Apologies for any confusion caused around the assessments being formal end of term exams. These are formative tasks to assess students' ability to recall and problem solve across different topic areas from this term, a key skill in Maths. Students are asked to prepare for this over the coming week, with guidance set on Go4schools on what to revise. The expectation on completing Sparx Maths will be paused to support students to revise, with the next Sparx homework due date being Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> Dec. Students who wish to continue to do Sparx Maths can of course do so.

Congratulations to Y11 students who have completed their mock exams and with which we have seen excellent progress from many students.
