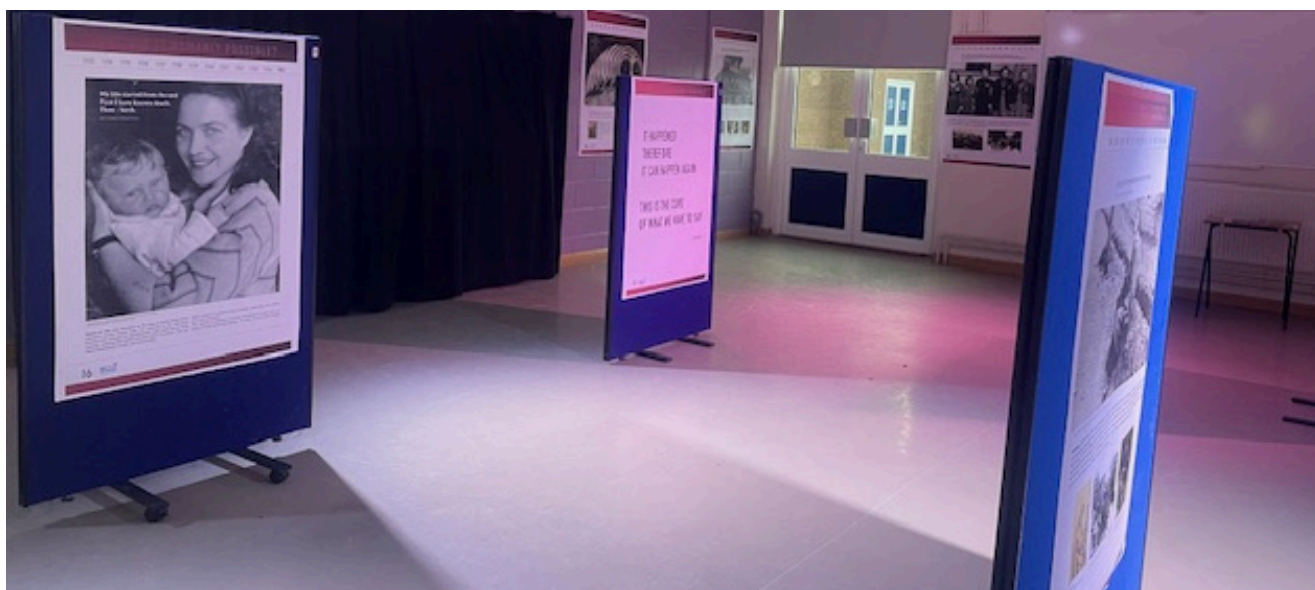

Holocaust Memorial Museum Comes to MVC



This week we had a moving exhibition: a Holocaust Memorial Museum – ‘Shoah – How was it humanly possible?’ Curated by school staff, the museum was set up on site to give students a rare and valuable opportunity to learn about one of the darkest chapters in human history in a meaningful and reflective way.

The exhibition explored the major historical aspects of the Holocaust, an unprecedented genocide that took place in Europe between 1933 and 1945.

Students visited the museum during lessons, as well as at break and lunchtime. The atmosphere inside the exhibition space was very reflective. Images, written information, as well as the voices of first-hand accounts encouraged visitors to pause, think, and confront difficult questions about humanity, prejudice, and moral responsibility.

Many students described the experience as “very moving” and “eye-opening.” Students reflected on how ordinary people were affected, how such atrocities were allowed to happen, and why it is vital that these events are never forgotten.

The school would like to extend special thanks to Mr Drum for supporting the exhibition with resources and helping to make the museum possible.

MVC Sports Studies Taster Lessons

This week, Year 9 students took part in a Sports Studies taster lesson during their core PE sessions, led by Mrs Buckland and Mr Carolan.

The OCR Level 2 Cambridge National in Sports Studies is a unique vocational qualification. It is a practical and engaging course, where 60% of the overall grade is assessed through coursework and 40% through a written examination, focusing on contemporary issues in sport.

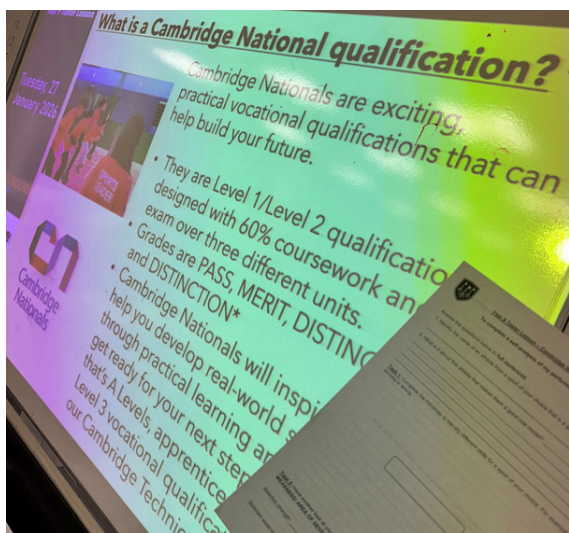
The qualification encourages students to think independently about sport and its application in real-life contexts, including practical performance, leadership, and evaluation of skills. During the taster lesson, students learned about the course structure and began exploring:

- Role models within sport
- The different skills required in their chosen sport
- Their own strengths and weaknesses in these skills

To conclude the lesson, students wrote paragraphs justifying their choices and explaining how these skills impact their performance. This activity reflects Task 2 of the R185 coursework, which students begin in Year 10.
