As a school we are working hard on our improvement journey, specifically to help improve student behaviour. Some feedback from the recent survey highlighted you would like some clarity on how the school makes sure pupils behave well. We would like to highlight the following and ask if you could please complete a short survey.

- The introduction of our new personal development programme educates pupils on making the right choices during our newly extended morning tutor time every morning.
- We have introduced new routines in lessons to create a more structured and focused learning environment, while our teachers have been working hard to give clearer and consistent explanations to students when they make the wrong choices, helping them understand expectations and how to make better decisions.
- Our new rewards system has also encouraged positive behaviour by recognising and celebrating student achievements.
- Additionally, we have reinforced our commitment to uninterrupted learning by not permitting disruption in lessons, supported by the implementation of a clear sanctions policy and a remove room where students can regulate their behaviour in a calm setting to work independently.
- During social time all duty staff wear high-viz jackets for additional presence and clear duty points are mapped out across the field at lunchtimes.

We hope this reassures you that we are working to ensure that behaviour supports a safe and calm learning environment for all children to thrive.

VE DAY CELEBRATIONS



As part of the VE day celebrations, the Year 10 students have been keeping up to date with interesting historical facts and anniversaries. The students were reminded that VE Day, or Victory in Europe Day, marks the unconditional surrender of Nazi Germany on May 7, 1945, and the end of World War II in Europe. The 80th anniversary in 2025 provides an opportunity for reflection, remembrance, and celebration of peace, honouring the sacrifices made by the Second World War generation

Planned events and activities (Countywide)

- National Commemorations: On May 8, 2025, a two-minute national silence will be observed at 12:00 PM across the UK to honour those who served in the war.
- Military Procession: A military procession and flypast will take place in London, featuring participation from veterans and members of the Royal Family.
- Local Events: Communities are encouraged to hold their own commemorative events, including church services, bell ringing, and public gatherings to reflect on the significance of the day.
- National Memorial Arboretum: A special commemorative event will be held at the National Memorial Arboretum, where WWII veterans and their families can gather to remember their experiences.
- Church Participation: Churches across England will ring their bells at 6:30 PM on VE Day, echoing the sounds of celebration from 1945, and will hold services to commemorate the anniversary.
