2. Creating a positive school culture

We are fostering a respectful and focused learning environment by:

- Strengthening behaviour procedures to support positive conduct
- ✓ Enhancing attendance systems to ensure all pupils are in school and learning
- Educating pupils on respect, inclusion, and diversity
- ✓ Improving communication with parents

What success looks like:

- Increased attendance rates
- Increased positive points and rewards for pupils
- Fewer negative behaviour incidents and suspensions
- Pupils and parents reporting a positive school culture

Key areas of focus

3. Supporting personal growth

A well-rounded education is about more than just academics. We are ensuring:

- A strong personal development curriculum, including PSHE and careers guidance
- A focus on positive learning habits and character development
- A welcoming and inclusive school culture where every pupil feels valued

- · A reduction in discriminatory language
- Recognition through work towards a national inclusion award

Our aims

By the end of 2024/25 we aim to

- ✓ A strong personal development curriculum, including PSHE and careers guidance
- A focus on positive learning habits and character development
- A welcoming and inclusive school culture where every pupil feels valued
- ✓ Improve the number of pupils achieving strong grades in English and maths (measured through the percentage of pupils achieving grade 4, 5 and above)
- ✓ Improve attendance so it is at least in line with national averages.
- Improve behaviour so that suspensions and behaviour incidents reduce, particularly for incidents involving discrimination.
- ☑ Improve communication and have this confirmed by parent feedback.
- ✓ Improve standards and culture so that pupils feel positive about school.
- ✓ Have improvements recognised by Ofsted so the school is no longer judged 'inadequate'

By the end of 2025/26 we aim to

- ✓ Improve the number of pupils achieving top grades in English and maths (measured through the percentage of pupils achieving grade 4, 5, 7 and above)
- ✓ Improve attendance so it is above national averages.
- ✓ Improve behaviour so that suspensions and behaviour incidents reduce significantly; incidents involving discrimination are rare
- Improve communication and culture so that the majority of parents would recommend the school
